



## **BUDGET HEARING**

#### **1. Discussion and comments relative to the Proposed Fiscal Year 2006 Budget.**

County Manager William Wilson noted the first reading of the FY 2006 Budget would be held on June 20, 2005 at the Extraordinary Session of the Board of Commissioners. The second reading would be held on June 23, 2005 at a Special Called Meeting. The budget being considered incorporates all changes made during the budget preparation process.

Commissioner Flowers-Taylor voiced questions about the overall budget for Executive; about training for the Board of Elections and Voter Registration; Cooperative Extension Service; and the practice of some County employees taking cars home, particularly Sheriff's Deputies, those who live out of Spalding County and those who may not be responders in case of an emergency situation.
