

Board of Commissioners - Regular Meeting July 1, 2024, 6:00 PM Room 108, Spalding County Annex Agenda

The Spalding County Board of Commissioners held a Regular Meeting on Monday, July 1, 2024, in Room 108 of the Spalding County Annex Building located at 119 E. Solomon Street, Griffin, Georgia beginning at 6:00 p.m. with Chairman Clay Davis presiding. Commissioners Rita Johnson and Gwen Flowers-Taylor were present for the meeting, Commissioner Ryan Bowlden and James Dutton were absent from the meeting. Also present were County Manager, Dr. Steve Ledbetter, County Attorney, Stephanie Windham, and Deputy County Clerk, Ragan Jones to record the minutes.
